## From Night-Drop to Night Watch

Late night desert temperatures can average in the 40s, and it was such a night when what must have seemed like a fun car ride at the end of the day quickly turned into a dog's worst nightmare...

10-year old Reggie was taken by his owner and dumped in the shelter night-drop kennel—abandoned, betrayed in the cruelest way! It was cold. He was alone, scared, and frantically trying to get out to find his owner. Reggie spent three weeks in the back of the shelter anxiously pacing and barking, looking for his family.

He was running out of time when a Thulani volunteer happened to visit, spotted Reggie and connected with him. But Thulani was full; we had no room for Reggie. Miraculously he is alive today- because a foster family stepped up to offer Reggie a safe haven while Thulani searched for his Forever Home.

Reggie spent four months in his wonderful foster home where learned he would never be abandoned again, where he was loved, cared for and, most important to Reggie, he had children to watch over. He was gentle with them and watched over them as they played. A benevolent protector, he would keep "his kids" safe while Thulani searched.

Reggie attracted many potential adopters but, after further discussion, they were not the right fit. It took some time. Then the right family asked to meet Reggie and, after initial conversations, the pieces began to fall into place. This could be the perfect fit! But because Reggie was over 350 miles away at his foster home a special meeting and transport had to be arranged. It began early one morning, when Reggie made the long trip from the southern California desert to the Central California Coast, staying the night in a hotel - likely for the first time. Throughout, Reggie demonstrated his beautiful temperament and manners--at

and understood he would have another family to watch over. He demonstrated that he was just fine with little fingers poking and prodding, hugs, kisses, and happy shrill little voices, and he laid down on the patio and sighed. A decision had been made. Reggie would have his Forever Family.

It was with happy tears that we watched Reggie drive off with his Forever Family, Aloendra and Joe C. and their three young children to their home in Seaside. Congratulations Reggie and happy-ever-after!
